## ORDER AMENDING NUNC PRO TUNC PROPOSED FINDINGS OF FACT; CONCLUSIONS OF LAW; AND RECOMMENDED ORDER

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In reviewing the Proposed Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Recommended Order that the Hearings Bureau issued on Thursday, October 12, 2006, the hearing examiner noticed that Paragraph 6 of the Findings of Fact and Paragraph 7 of the Conclusions of Law contain inaccurate findings that the hearing examiner did not find to be the facts of this case nor a rationale for the recommended decision in this case. Accordingly, the hearing examiner makes the following order *nunc pro tunc* amending the findings of fact and conclusions of law to correct the errors contained in those two paragraphs. In all other respects, the Proposed Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Recommended Order that the Hearings Bureau issued on Thursday, October 12, 2006 remain unchanged.

Paragraph 6 of the findings of fact is amended as follows to reflect the actual findings of fact made by the hearing examiner:

6. Gillespie was not at the project site during this time. Apparently he was off getting another fixture for the project to replace one that had been broken. Later, Hutchings spoke with Blazevich about Blazevich's working on high voltage at the

project site. Blazevich indicated that Gillespie was having Blazevich continue to work while getting Blazevich an electrician's license. Record transcript, Page 56, lines 13 through 21.

Conclusions of Law, Paragraph 7, is amended as follows to reflect the actual rationale and findings of fact made by the hearing examiner:

7. In Case Number CC-06-0047-ELE, BSD proved by a preponderance of the evidence that Gillispie violated Montana Codes Annotated § 37-1-316(2), (8), (16) and (18), Montana Codes Annotated § 37-68-301, and Administrative Rule of Montana 24.141.403(5). Gillispie's unlicensed employee Blazevich was caught in the act of engaging in unlicensed electrical work when he was caught attaching a fixture to a high voltage line. Gillispie knew that Blazevich was doing work that required a license while unlicensed and he permitted Blazevich to do so. This is demonstrated by Blazevich's comment to Hutchings at the work site that Gillispie was permitting Blazevich to work while attempting to get him a license. Furthermore, Gillispie was permitting this conduct at a time when Gillispie's licenses were on probation for earlier misconduct.
